Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) estimates that at least 27 aveanna<sup><sup>est</sup></sup> percent of adults in America healthcare aged 65 and higher have diabetes. In total, diabetes

affects more than 34 million people in the United States. Diabetes keeps the body from properly using the energy gained from eating food. The symptoms of diabetes, such as thirst, unusual weight loss, or increased fatigue, may seem harmless at first. If left untreated, however, diabetes can result in serious health problems. Early diagnosis and treatment can significantly reduce complications.

Our goal at New Horizons is to help affected residents control their diabetes and prevent potentially serious complications. To this end, we have put in place a diabetes assistance program, wherein Aveanna nurses are available to check a resident's blood sugar based on the resident's doctor's order. These checks can be performed one or more times per day. The nurses will assist the resident by administering insulin either by syringe or insulin pen. Residents must provide and dispose of their own sharp containers. To learn more about New Horizons' diabetes assistance program, please contact the director on duty.
