LOCAL SCHOOL RECEIVES CUMMINGS

FOUNDATION GRANT: The Advanced Math and Science Academy (AMSA), a charter school in Marlborough, has close ties with the New Horizons community. Many AMSA students work in our dining room. The school also sends volunteers to help with activities or to provide tech support to residents who need assistance with their smartphones, tablets, and computers.

AMSA was recently awarded a grant from our parent organization, Cummings Foundation. The school will receive \$105,000 over three years. The money will fund a summer science experience to broaden student participation in engineering and increase access for underrepresented student populations in the AMSA communities.

Marlborough-based Employment Options and Marie Esther Health

Center are also among this year's Cummings grant recipients. Through its annual \$30 Million Grant Program, the Foundation seeks to support organizations working to improve local lives through education, housing assistance, workforce development, social justice, immigrant services, and mental health programs. To date, Cummings Foundation has awarded more than \$480 million in grants to nonprofits based in greater Boston.
