IMPROVE CONNECTION WITH WI-FI CALLING: Cellular service in the local area is poor, and our outreach to the network providers and government officials with the power to intervene has thus far generated no action. Residents with wireless internet in their homes may improve their service by enabling Wi-Fi calling on their smartphones (typically found within the Settings menu). This setting allows the phone to automatically route calls through the internet when cell service is poor. Need help? Visit Tech Help with the CSAs on Sundays and Wednesdays at 1:00 PM in the French Village. Note: If enabling Wi-Fi calling, you must enter your home address when prompted. EMS will use this information to locate you in the event of a Wi-Fi call to 911.)
