






DECK THE HALLS WITH CARE: Before you start stringing garlands, please take a moment to review our safe-decorating guidelines:

- Please use *only* flame-retardant decorations.
- Residents are welcome to place small holiday decorations in the alcoves near their suites, but fire regulations prohibit placing items that extend into the hallways.
- Please use a wreath hanger or the door knocker to hang any door decorations (no tacks or nails).
- Please keep candles away from windowsills and mantles, and never leave candles burning when you are not at home.
