

WI-FI CALLING: New

Horizons continues to work with local officials and network providers to advocate for improved cellular service. In the meantime, residents with smartphones can now boost their cell phone call coverage by connecting to the expanded Wi-Fi network throughout the 400 building.

Please note:

- You must connect to the wireless network and enable Wi-Fi calling in a setting on your phone.
 For assistance, please visit a Tech Help session on Sundays and Wednesdays from 1:00 to 2:00 PM.
- Wi-Fi calling only works with smartphones, such as iPhones or Androids. It does not work with basic call and text-only cell phones, such as flip phones.

HOUSE CALLS: Many New Horizons residents are taking advantage of the Home-Based Primary Care program available from Reliant Medical Group.

Reliant is a regional practice with multiple locations and more than 500 primary care providers and specialists in Central and Metrowest Massachusetts.

Patients over 65 have the option to see their PCP in their homes, rather than dealing with the hassle of finding transportation to a medical office. The team is led by Physician Assistant **Paige Lamica**. Each patient is seen by an advanced primary care provider and a team that includes nurses, a care manager, and other support staff. If you need additional services, such as lab work, radiology tests, or referrals to a specialist, your team will help coordinate and arrange those services.
