Curio Cabinet Spotlight: Beauty in Beachcombing





Scammers often target older adults, assuming they may be less familiar with technology or modern fraud tactics.

- **Medicare Scams** - Medicare will never call or visit asking for your personal and/or financial information.
- **Fake Accident/Grandparent Scams** - Scammers pose as relatives or someone helping them, claiming urgent need for money. Never send money under pressure.

Are You a Victim? If you suspect a scam, tell someone you trust. Money sent is often gone, but reporting the fraud can protect others.

Stay Alert, Stay Safe: If something feels suspicious, report it and ignore it. Always protect your personal information.

MEET YOUR NEW NEIGHBORS


Bob and Barbara Clark
